

Amur Maple (*Acer ginnala*/*A. tataricum* subsp. *ginnala*) Identification

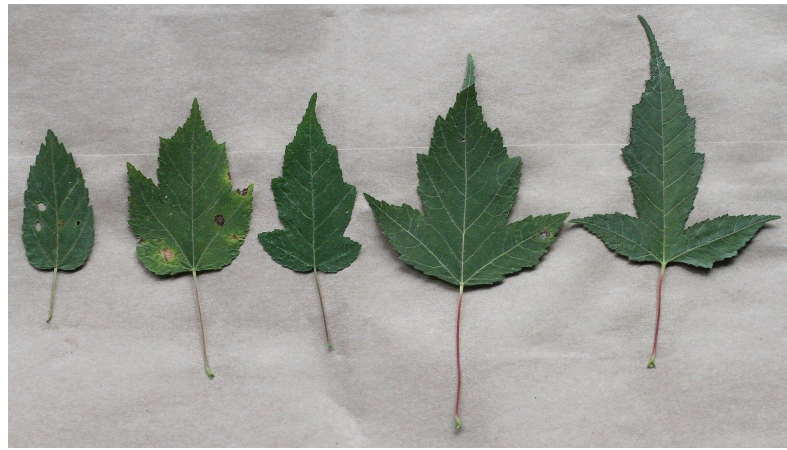

Overall: shrub or small tree, often multi-stemmed

Leaves: opposite, often with reddish leaf stalk, variable but usually with three lobes and a longer middle lobe, turning yellow or red in fall

Bark: grayish brown, smooth when young and slightly furrowed when older

Flowers: small yellow/white flowers in clusters, bloom April-May

Fruit: pairs of winged seeds nestled nearly parallel to each other, often persist through winter
