
Amur Maple (Acer ginnala/A. tataricum subsp. ginnala) Identification







Overall: shrub or small tree, often multi-stemmed **Leaves:** opposite, often with reddish leaf stalk, variable but usually with three lobes and a longer middle lobe, turning yellow or red in fall

Bark: grayish brown, smooth when young and slightly

furrowed when older

Flowers: small yellow/white flowers in clusters, bloom April-May **Fruit:** pairs of winged seeds nestled nearly parallel to each other,

often persist through winter
